



Originally inspired by Venezuela's El Sistema, In Harmony Stoke uses orchestral music making to improve the health, education and aspirations of young people in Stoke-on-Trent. In Harmony Stoke-on-Trent is delivered by City Music Service and is starting its third academic year working at Thistley Hough Academy.

Currently they are the only secondary school in the country involved in the programme. This year the project is bigger than ever as it is now working over three different year groups. Every pupil in Year 7 and 8 is learning a string, brass or woodwind instrument and there are 4 orchestras in each year group. This year a new Year 9 In Harmony option has been designed for pupils to continue their musical learning as part of their option choices. Over 450 students and staff are learning across the school. The programme is funded by Arts Council England and the Department of Education and is partnered with a project in Telford based at Old Park Primary school.

The last year has seen a number of exciting partnerships including workshops with Shrewsbury Folk Festival and a careers talk 'Music in the Workplace' led by members of University Hospital North Midlands Orchestra.

Thursday 6th March 2019 – Voices Together Songbirds Big Sing! Thursday 27th June 2019 – Voices Together Songbirds Big Sing!



Focus on our 'Excellence in Music Provision Awards'

The Hub has supported schools for the last three years by offering a self-assessment 'Music Audit Tool'. This enables schools to measure the level of musical engagement within the school and to fully utilise the opportunities provided by the Hub.

We are pleased to report that almost 250 schools have achieved an award at some point on the scale between Copper and Platinum, with many revisiting their award level to recognise improvement through this time. This is a significant achievement and further demonstrates the commitment many of you make to providing an outstanding offer for young people in your schools.

After three years of running this support programme, we are relaunching the new and updated Audit and Award criteria which captures the learning and feedback received from the support visits completed to date. All awards that are 'in date' from the previous criteria will of course still stand.

Previously, awards have been made for the current academic year only, so we are aware that many schools will be due a re-audit or would like to progress to the next level. We will now be making awards for a two-year period to give a firm and achievable timescale for re-audits and we hope that many of you who have not had a visit for two years will now do so during the year ahead.



Hub Project Updates, News and Opportunities to Work with Us!

Furthering Talent News: August 2018

The North-West Midlands Music Education Hub continues to work in partnership with Awards for Young Musicians (AYM) on Furthering Talent, a programme for students who have been identified as having emerging potential and who need support with their musical progression.

AYM has been working with music students across the region since 2013 and Furthering Talent is proving a real success. Each child has their own Individual Learning Plan (ILP) to help support their musical learning goals. An extra-curricular programme of musical opportunities is also a key part of Furthering Talent, and young people also receive additional support for their musical progression, according to their own individual needs. This includes collective opportunities for the young people via Music Days and Get Together events.

Get Together focusing on performance

Our most recent Get Together was held at The Prince of Wales Theatre in Cannock on 21st June and saw a total of 12 students and their families attend. The Get Together began with students and teachers rehearsing a mass performance of the Ghostbusters theme before several student solo performances. Students were encouraged at the start of term to prepare a piece for the Get Together and these comprised of unaccompanied solo pieces and accompanied or duet pieces with teachers. There was a wide range of instruments played across the pieces.

Everyone then took part in a group conversation which focused on the benefits of being on the AYM Furthering Talent Project, with many students feeling that the programme gave them access to a creative art that they would not otherwise have. Parents expressed their appreciation of the programme and the fact that without the AYM support, they may not be able to meet the costs of music tuition for their children. There was also time to talk about what students would like to see at future Get Together events with some great ideas coming forward - we'll keep you posted! The day ended with a fantastic performance of the Ghostbusters theme tune by students and teachers.

Professional Development Opportunities

On Saturday 8th September 2018, AYM delivered the first of two Identifying Musical Talent and Potential Training sessions at Entrust in Stafford. These training sessions are for those who want to help others make a true assessment of who has potential in the classroom.

AYMs Identifying Talent and Potential has been delivered to over 1000 music leaders since 2008. The success of the course means they are looking for new facilitators to help spread the word even further. It's an opportunity to work with peers from a range of backgrounds: class teachers, instrumental teachers and other music leaders. The training will focus on practical instrument based music making that can be used to help spot musical potential in whole group settings. You'll learn by doing, so be prepared to explore the borders between music and noise!

By participating in this course you will:

- Find out strengths you don't know you have
- Have the chance to reflect on your own practice
- Learn to challenge your views and to challenge those of others
- Explore the differences between music leading and music teaching and how these differences can be seen in the light of identifying musical potential
- Earn some additional income (£150 to £300 for every session you lead in the future, depending on the length)

Beatbox Orchestra is suitable for all ages and abilities. It teaches teamwork, co-operation, builds confidence and proves that music is for everybody.

iPad Orchestra

iPad Orchestra allows children to learn to play a variety of virtual instruments in a group using a device they're probably already familiar with. Our team can get your class creating great music – as an ensemble – in as little as an hour. There are no barriers for children who might never have picked up a traditional instrument before as technology is at the heart of everyday life. iPad Orchestra is ideal to help young people appreciate that smartphones and tablets aren't just for browsing the internet – they're tools with almost endless creative opportunities.

Improved Musical School Scheme

This year has seen big updates to the Scheme which are now complete. We're looking to fully bed-in this new Scheme over the coming year and gather your feedback. We hope you're enjoying the new song units as well as the brand new Reflect, Rewind, Replay units at the end of each year which are much more comprehensive than before. Wider Musical School Updates

Outside of the Scheme, there are several new developments. We are adding more support for musical instruments generally. In particular, you'll see a lovely new set of courses for Recorder called 'Blown Away' written by Heather Ward and there will also be a Samba course which is the first in a series of materials for large-scale percussion. Later in the year we'll also be improving our Ukulele course. Singers will be supported with 25 great new songs in Charanga Sing! Elsewhere, we're continuing to add exciting new music teaching apps. The all new Rhythm Grid app will give you endless new possibilities for fun and games with rhythms and you'll see something similar for beat-making in the form of our new beats app.



Introducing YUMU - taking Charanga Music World to the next level

For teachers who like to use Music World, YUMU will offer a much improved experience for you and the children. YUMU will make it easier to share songs and activities with the children for them to use outside lessons. They will no longer need to navigate through the instrumental music worlds before getting to the things you've shared. The instrument worlds will still be available to use, if you wish to share any of them with the children.



New SEND CREATE projects

We're launching four brilliant new CREATE projects in the SEND section this summer which we've developed with Charanga's new SEND technology specialist Ben Sellers and the 'Brighter Future for SEND Music in Greater Essex' project. CREATE shows how to use iPads to compose, improvise and perform, and are designed to work across the whole SEND spectrum, from PMLD settings to PRUs.
